## **Publication policy**

Przestrzeń Społeczna (Social Space) publishes high quality original theoretical and methodological work, as well as theoretically-informed empirical research in the social sciences and humanities. It is currently published twice per year. The journal's editorial policy is based on the assumption that good theories, solid methodologies, robust discussion and thorough scientific critique are essential for efficient practice. Both quantitative and qualitative articles are accepted, based on positivist or humanistic methodologies, if they meet the high standards of peer reviews and if they are not being submitted for publication elsewhere.

In preparing a paper for submission to *PS/SS*, you should not aim to be uncritically exhaustive in synthesising research, rather you should concentrate on the most promising trends and developments within the field. Aim at the widest possible international, i.e. not only Anglo-Saxon, coverage and consider the relevance of tangential or parallel developments in other fields. Wherever possible, you should explore cross-disciplinary links and evaluate the wider intellectual significance of your arguments and the research to which they relate.

Przestrzeń Społeczna (Social Space) is published on a non-profit basis. It includes:

- distribution via the internet;
- internet access free of charge to all published texts;
- full use of the potential of electronic media: colour illustrations and supplementary material (data sets, movies and animated visualisation, etc.) at no extra charge, efficient linkage of related information, etc.;
- copyright retained by the author(s);
- publication of high quality revised papers emerging from a publication process with peer-review and interactive public discussion.

The Editor and Publisher reserve the right to replace a PDF file if purely technical corrections are necessary (e.g. corrupt file or incorrect bibliographical entry). Under no circumstances will there be any change of the contents after the Author's correction.

Before submitting your manuscript, please ensure you carefully read and adhere to all of the guidelines and instructions to authors. Manuscripts not conforming to these guidelines will be returned.

In submitting the manuscript, the authors certify that:

- they are authorised by their co-authors to enter into these arrangements;
- the work described has not been published before (except in the form of an abstract or proceedings-type publication including discussion papers or as part of a published lecture or thesis), that it is not under consideration for publication elsewhere, that its publication has been approved by all the authors and by the responsible authorities tacitly or explicitly of the institutes, if necessary, where the work has been carried out;
- they secure the right to reproduce any material that has already been published or copyrighted elsewhere;
- they agree to the following licence and copyright agreement;
- they will not publish the submitted material elsewhere even if they withdraw their text from the editor unless they obtain the editor's consent for such a publication.
